QUICK NOTES

Ball State, after an idle week, rose to No. 20 in this week's Associated Press poll and No. 22 in the USA TODAY Coaches poll. The season's first BCS poll has the Cardinals as No. 20. BSU is ranked this year for the first time in program history.

Of the 23 conference games played thus far in 2008, 13 have been decided by seven points or less, with nine of those 23 by four points or fewer in the final margin.

Buffalo played its second consecutive overtime game, beating Army 27-24 a week after losing to Western Michigan. Since 1995, there have been 46 games that went into overtime with 24 of those taking place in conference games. The MAC is 12-10 in non-conference overtime games, which includes a 2-0 bowl record in extended contests.

Northern Illinois (4-3) has doubled its win total from 2007 and is 3-1 in the conference and in the thick of the MAC West Division title chase. NIU hosts Bowling Green Saturday, then plays next Nov. 5 at Ball State.

Central Michigan set a Kelly/Shorts Stadium record for single game attendance with its audience of 30,302 in the 38028 win over rival WMU. QB Brian Brunner (346 yards, 1 TD) started in place of Dan LeFevour, who was a late scratch because of an ankle injury suffered last weekend against Temple.

WMU quarterback Tim Hiller set a school record and a Kelly/Shorts Stadium record with 471 yards passing.

MAC POSTSEASON SCHEDULE AND TIEBREAKER

MARATHON MAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME



Friday - December 5 at 8 pm (ET)
Ford Field - Detroit, Mich. - ESPN2

This marks the fifth Marathon MAC Championship football game played at Detroit's Ford Field and the 12th league title game overall since the conference went to divisional play in 1997.

NOTES: From 1997-2000 the game was held at Marshall Stadium in Huntington, W.Va., before moving to alternating divisional winner home stadiums from 2001-2003. In 2004 the game moved into Ford Field, also the site of the Motor City Bowl. Six of the first 12 games have been decided by eight points or less. In 2005 Akron edged Northern Illinois 31-30 on a game-winning touchdown pass and PAT with 10 seconds remaining. The 1999 game-winner was scored with 10 seconds left when Marshall slid by Western Michigan 34-30. Four of the current 13 MAC teams have won the championship game with eight of the current 13 schools having played in the game. The game has been televised on the ESPN Network since 1999, with ABC (2000), ESPN (1997, 2006-07) ESPN2 (1998, 1999, 2001-05) covering the game. Central Michigan University is the defending champion and has won the last two games, beating Miami in 2007 and Ohio in 2006.

INTERNATIONAL BOWL



Saturday - January 3 at Noon (ET)

This marks the third-ever International Bowl, which the MAC has been a part of since its inception in January of 2007. The game is slated for a match up between a MAC and a Big East school.

NOTES: The MAC has yet to win in its first two International Bowl competitions. In 2007 Western Michigan dropped a 27-24 contest to Cincinnati in the inaugural game. The 2008 game saw Rutgers out score Ball State 52-30. The third MAC bowl tie-in, the game allowed WMU to advance to its first bowl game since the 1988 California Raisin Bowl, and for Ball State to participate in its first post season bowl since the 1996 Las Vegas Bowl. This is the only major bowl, besides the 1937 Bacardi Bowl, to be played outside the United States. That Jan. 1, 1937 contest featured a tie game at 7-7 between Auburn and Villanova.

MOTOR CITY BOWL



Friday - December 26 at 8 pm (ET)
Ford Field - Detroit, Mich. - ESPN2

This marks the 12th Motor City Bowl, all which have involved a MAC team. The game pits a MAC team against an opponent from the Big Ten, although in its history opponents have represented schools from SEC, Conference USA, Big East, Mountain West, and Sun Belt, as well as the Big Ten.

NOTES: This year's Motor City Bowl marks the longest tenured bowl tie-in in MAC history. For the 12th consecutive year a MAC team will send a representative to the MCB, bypassing the previous mark of 11 straight California Raisin Bowl games from 1981-1991. The MAC has compiled a 6-5 record in the MCB, which was played at the Silverdome in Pontiac from 1997-2001. Five of the first 11 MCB contests have been decided by a touchdown or less. Central Michigan has represented the MAC in the last two bowl contests. In 2006 the Chippewas defeated Middle Tennessee State 31-14, and then in 2007 lost on a game-ending field goal as time expired to Purdue 51-48. Last year's game was the highest scoring contest in MCB history.

GMAC BOWL



Tuesday - December 6 at 8 pm (ET)
Ladd-Peebles Stadium - Mobile, Ala. - ESPN

The MAC has sent a school to the GMAC Bowl in each of the last seven seasons as this year celebrates the bowl's 10th game. In the last six years, five different conference schools have represented the MAC in competition vs. a Conference USA opponent. The MAC is 5-2 all-time in the GMAC Bowl.

NOTES: The partnership that began in 2001 allowed the MAC to have multi-bowl tie-ins for the first time in league history. The league's first year resulted in a double-overtime, 64-61 win by Marshall over East Carolina in what was then the highest scoring bowl game ever. Since that first MAC game in 2001, the league has been represented by Miami, Bowling Green (twice), Toledo and Ohio in Mobile. Ladd-Peebles Stadium is also the site of the Senior Bowl game, during which MAC QBs twice won that game's MVP honors - Chad Pennington (Marshall) in 1999, and Charlie Frye (Akron) in 1994.

Divisional Champions/Tiebreaker

The divisional championship shall be decided on conference winning percentage. If two or more teams are tied for the championship, they shall be considered divisional co-champions. The following tie-breaking formula shall be used to determine which team will represent that division in the MAC Championship game:

1. Head-to-head competition
 - a. In the event of a multiple-team (two or more teams) tie, the team with the best head-to-head record amongst the tied teams wins the tie-breaker;
 - b. In a two-team tie, head-to-head competition will be the first criteria;
 - c. If two teams did not play, the second criteria is used to break the tie;
2. Record of tied teams within the division [versus rank order, highest to lowest, of division teams]
 - a. The above tie-breaker procedure is used to determine rank order in the division;
 - b. Team(s) eliminated in the second tie-breaker criterion are not included in further consideration in the tie-breaking formula;
 - c. Head-to-head competition is again used to break the tie between the remaining tied teams.
3. Comparison of conference winning percentage of cross-over opponents of tied teams;
 - a. Tie-breaker is awarded to the team whose cross-division opponents had the best cumulative conference winning percentage;
 - b. Head-to-head competition is used to break the tie between the two tied teams.
4. If multiple teams remain tied, the final tie-breaker is as follows:
 - a. Record of tied teams versus cross-division opponents in rank order;
 - b. Head-to-head competition is used to break the tie between the two tied teams.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Dennis Kennedy, RB, Akron

Sr., Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. (Stranahan HS)

Kennedy rushed for 277 yards and the winning touchdown on 25 carries in 42-35 win at Eastern Michigan. His 277 yards are the second highest total in school history and the most since going to FBS (I-A). Kennedy had a career-long 73 yard run and scored the game-winner with 14 seconds left from four yards. He scored three rushing TDs during the game.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Davonte Shannon, SS, Buffalo

So., Jeannette, Pa. (Jeannette HS)

Davonte Shannon, So., SS, 6-0, 193, Jeannette, PA/Jeanette HS Shannon had a career-best 20 tackles, the most by any Bull in their 10 years in Division I-A football, two for loss. He led a UB defense that held Army to 46 yards in the fourth quarter and overtime to allow the Bulls to come back from a two touchdown deficit for a 27-24 overtime win over Army. Shannon had 12 solo stops and was involved in the tackle that caused the fumble that set up Buffalo's game-tying score.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Nate Parseghian, PK, Miami

Sr., PK, Sylvania, Ohio (Hargrave Military Academy)

With his team trailing 20-14 in the second half, Parseghian connected on field goals from 37 yards (third quarter) and 36 yards (fourth quarter) to pull his team even. Miami would go on to a 27-20 victory at Bowling Green. He also had three PAT and is now 12-of-13 on field goals this season.

ADDITIONAL NOMINEES - EAST DIVISION

OFFENSE

Anthony Turner, RB, Bowling Green (led the Falcons in rushing and receiving vs. Miami. Turner had 41 rush yards on 12 carries and 7 receptions for 88 yards.)

Ernest Jackson, FL, Buffalo (had a career-best 9 receptions for 134 yards and a game-tying score forcing overtime in a 27-24 win over Army. Jackson helped the Bulls rally from a two-touchdown deficit with a first down reception on fourth down on that drive, and also had a 32-yard reception on a third-and-20 on another scoring drive.)

J.R. Taylor, RB, Miami (the freshman rushed for a career-high 127 yards on 18 carries and scored the game-winning TD in a 27-20 win at Bowling Green. On the drive for the winning score he rushed for 69 yards on 6 carries.)

DEFENSE

Diyral Briggs, DE, Bowling Green (had 7 tackles, a sack, a tackle for a loss and a QB hurry vs. Miami.)

Joe Coniglio, DE, Miami (6 tackles and 2 sacks for minus 20 yards in a 27-20 win at Bowling Green. He had a 10-yard sack in BG's final drive the helped clinch the victory.)

SPECIAL TEAMS

Andy Hildreth, H, Akron (the holder on FG attempts, Hildreth grabbed a blocked kick and rushed for a first down with 39 seconds left at Eastern Michigan. The Zips would score and go on to a 42-35 win.)

WEST DIVISION

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Brian Brunner, QB, Central Michigan

Sr., Hubertus, Wisc. (Hartford Union HS)

In a 38-28 win over Western Michigan, Brunner completed 20-of-28 attempts (71.4 pct.) for 346 yards and a touchdown. He added 22 rushing yards on seven attempts as he made his first start since 2006. Brunner stepped in for Dan LeFevour, who missed the game because of an ankle injury. He was 10-of-15 on third down throws and had a TD pass on the Chippewas' opening drive to set the tone for the offense, which produced season-high in points (38) and yards (524).

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Alex Kube, LB, Northern Illinois

So., Cary, Ill. (Cary-Grove HS)

Kube made a season-best six tackles (four solo) to rank second on the Huskie team while recording one of the biggest defensive plays of the game for NIU with a sack of Toledo QB Aaron Opelt in a 38-7 win over the Rockets. That play came in the second quarter with NIU holding a 14-0 lead. Toledo faced third and six from the NIU 16 yard line and Kube sacked Opelt for a 13-yard loss to the 29 yard line. From there, the Rockets missed a field goal and Northern Illinois went on to extend its lead to 21-0 on their next drive. It was Kube's first sack of the season but he does rank fourth on the team with 29 tackles.

Andrew Aguila, PK, Central Michigan

Jr., Bellflower, Calif. (Compton JC)

Aguila scored eight points in a 38-28 win over Western Michigan. He had a 20-yard field goal and was a perfect 5-for-5 on PAT.

Chandler Harnish, QB, Northern Illinois (in his first start since the second game of the season, Harnish led NIU to a 38-7 win over Toledo by passing for 3 TDs. He completed 12-of-16 passes for 173 yards and had a run of 32 yards to set up a field goal.)

Stephen Williams, WR, Toledo (caught a game-high 9 passes for 75 yards in a loss at Northern Illinois.)

Tim Hiller, QB, Western Michigan (passed for a school record 471 yards, completing 38-of-51 attempts in a loss at Central Michigan. Had 2 TDs with no interceptions.)

Frank Zombo, DE, Central Michigan (had 6 tackles and 2.5 sacks vs. Western Michigan. His sacks both came on third down plays, forcing a punt.)

Brad Othram, DL, Eastern Michigan (had a team-leading 9 tackles, with 2 sacks for minus yards, 3 tackles for a loss for 15 yards, and a forced fumble.)

Archie Donald, LB, Toledo (had a game-high 11 tackles at Northern Illinois.)

Austin Pritchard, LB, Western Michigan (had a career-high 17 tackles with 2 tackles for a loss at Central Michigan.)

STREAKS AND SUCH

Ball State has won nine consecutive regular season games dating back to last year ... Toledo is 0-3 at home this season but 2-2 on the road ... no MAC East team has won back-to-back games thus far ... Bowling Green, the preseason East Division favorite, is 0-3 at home and 3-1 on the road. The Falcons have handed Big East leader Pittsburgh (5-1) its only loss thus far ... both of Temple's wins this year are on the road (Army, Miami). The Owls are 0-2 at home ... Akron is 4-1 on the road and 0-3 at home.

NATIONAL NOTES

Several MAC players have received national recognition this season. On Oct. 16 Buffalo QB Drew Willy was named one of 10 finalists for the Johnny Unitas "Golden Arm Award" given to the top senior quarterback in the nation. Willy is a four-year starter for the Bulls and guided the team to a share of the East Division title in 2007. Toledo's Tyrell Herbert was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week for returning an interception 100 yards for a score in the Rockets 13-10 win at Michigan on Oct. 11. In that same game, PK Alex Steigerwald was recognized as a Lou Groza Placekicker Star of the Week for his game-winning field goal. The week prior, Akron's Igor Iveljic was also tabbed as a Groza honoree for his winning three-pointer in overtime at Kent State.

MAC WEST DIVISION: Central Michigan (4-0) and Ball State (3-0) are the only undefeated teams in the division while Western Michigan (to CMU) and Northern Illinois (to WMU) have one loss each. WMU is idle this week while CMU is at Toledo (1-2) and BSU hosts Eastern Michigan (1-3). NIU hosts East Division foe Bowling Green (1-2) in a crossover game.

MAC EAST DIVISION: The East Division race continues to be a log jam with five teams having two losses and no team with a winning record. Akron (2-2) stands atop the division with Bowling Green, Buffalo Miami and Ohio all at 1-2. Temple (1-3) and Kent State (0-3) each have three losses. Two games within the division take place this week with Ohio at Temple (Tuesday) and Kent State at Miami. Bowling Green plays at Northern Illinois in a cross divisional contest.

MAC QUICK NOTES

MAC defensive coordinators in the West Division face the task of trying to shutdown three veteran QBs, all juniors, who have combined for over 22,000 passing yards in their careers. Central Michigan's Dan LeFevour, Ball State's Nate Davis, and Western Michigan's Tim Hiller all have posted stellar numbers and are on track to leave their names in the MAC recordbook.

UP NEXT - OCT. 28, Nov. 1

Three conference games and two non-conference contests are on the slate for next week. On Tuesday, Oct. 28, Ohio hosts Buffalo in an East Division match up on ESPN. Saturday Nov. 1 shows four games on the lineup with Eastern Michigan at Western Michigan and Kent State at Bowling Green in conference action. Non-conference outings have Temple at Navy and Central Michigan at Indiana.

SACK MAN

Northern Illinois Larry English, with a QB sacks vs. Toledo Oct. 18, upped his career total to 28. That total ties him for sixth place in league history with Dan Williams of Toledo (1990-92). Next on the list is Bob Beemer (1982-85) of Miami at 29. The all-time mark is 38 by Jason Babin of Western Michigan (2000-03).

DANTE LOVE UPDATE: Ball State wide receiver Dante Love suffered an injury during the first half of Ball State's football game at Indiana on Sept. 20. He experienced numbness and tingling on the field and was transported to Bloomington Hospital and was taken to Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis for further evaluation. Love suffered a cervical spine fracture and spinal cord injury which required surgery to stabilize the fracture. On Monday, Sept. 22, it was announced that due to the nature of Love's injury, his football playing career is expected to be over. However, after a rehabilitation period, he is expected to be able to live a normal and healthy life. At the time of his injury, Love led the MAC in all-purpose yards (197.8 ypg), receiving yards per game (115.0) and receptions per game (7.0), and ranked fifth in kickoff returns (26.7 ypr). As of Oct. 13, Love had been released from the rehab center, is back on campus rehabbing in Muncie, and is "doing great" according to head coach Brady Hoke.

OH BROTHER

Toledo WR Nick Moore etched his name into the MAC recordbook and Rockets' lore with his 20 receptions, tying a MAC record, in the Oct. 11 win at Michigan. On Sept. 20, 2003, his older brother, Lance Moore, did the same when with 43 seconds left in the fourth quarter grabbed a game-winning 9-yard TD pass in a 35-31 win over No. 9 ranked Pittsburgh. Lance went on to set a school record with 222 receptions, the 10th highest total in league schedule, for 2,776 yards, the 15th most in MAC history.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Buffalo's Drew Willy is one of seven fourth-year starting QBs in the nation at the I-A level- the complete list - Rudy Carpenter, Arizona State; Curtis Painter, Purdue; Mike Teel, Rutgers; Willie Tuitama, Arizona; Drew Weatherford, Florida State; Pat White, West Virginia; Drew Willy, Buffalo.

THE MAC AT 62: The Mid-American Conference celebrates its 62nd year of gridiron competition and will hold its 12th championship game in 2008. This year's Marathon MAC Championship football game will be played Friday, Dec. 5, at Ford Field in Detroit. This year's title game will be the fifth played at Ford Field.

EIGHT FOR ALL: Unlike 2007 when MAC teams played an unbalanced schedule, each MAC school will play eight conference games in 2008. Due to seven teams compiling the East Division and six teams in the West Division, two East Division match ups will not occur [Akron vs. Miami; and Bowling Green vs. Temple]. This format is reflective of the 1999 season when two East Divisions match ups also did not occur [Akron vs. Marshall; and Bowling Green vs. Buffalo] in order to facilitate an eight-game conference schedule for the 13-team league.

SUPER SOPHS RETURN:

The three MAC teams that went to a bowl game last year all were led by sophomore quarterbacks and each signal caller returns for 2008. Two-time defending league champion Central Michigan (Motor City Bowl) has Dan LeFevour returning to add to his career numbers of 6,683 passing yards and 53 touchdown passes. Bowling Green (GMAC Bowl) welcomes Tyler Sheehan after his first year as a starter that produced 3,123 passing yards and 23 scoring strikes. Ball State (International Bowl) will send out third-year starter Nate Davis and his numbers of 5,642 passing yards and 48 touchdown passes.

THE BEST ARE BACK:

Northern Illinois defensive end Larry English, voted by MAC head coaches as winner of the Vern Smith Leadership Award as a junior last year, returns to anchor the Huskie defense. English became just the second defensive player in 26 years to win the award, joining Central Michigan linebacker Ray Bentley (1982) in that category. English is also the first non-senior since Byron Leftwich in 2001 and 2002 to win the award and to return for the next season. Coupled with Huskie running back Garrett Wolfe capturing the honor in 2006, NIU is the only school in MAC history to have different players win the award in back-to-back years. English led the MAC with 10.5 sacks last season.

In addition, MAC Defensive Player of the Year, linebacker Clayton Mullins of Miami, returns to the RedHawk defense. Mullins topped the league in tackles with 11 tackles per game while leading the RedHawks to the Marathon MAC Championship game. He also had 13 tackles for a loss.

On the other side of the ball, Offensive Player of the Year in Central Michigan quarterback Dan LeFevour is back for his junior season. LeFevour completed 355-of-543 pass attempts last year for 27 touchdowns and 3,652 yards. He led the Chippewas to their second consecutive MAC title and berth in the Motor City Bowl.

CMU also was the recipient of the Freshman of the Year talent in 2007 with Antonio Brown capturing that honor. Brown accounted for 2,267 yards of total offense and eight touchdowns (6 receiving, 1 receiving and 1 via kickoff return). His total offense yards established a league record for freshmen. Brown gained 1,003 yards on 102 receptions, 1,048 yards on 40 kickoff returns and 142 yards on 13 punt returns.
